How it works: Send series registration form and enrollment fee payable to ISI to : Jamie Baringer, c/o BGSU Ice Arena, 417 North Mercer, Bowling Green OH, 43403. Participants are awarded points for placement in each event they take part in at the participating competitions over the season. Competitors receive 5 points for 1st place, 4 points for 2nd place, 3 points for 3rd place, 2 points for 4th place and 1 points for 5th place. Partner events will each receive credit for placement points. Points are tracked throughout the season. ISI District Series Champions in the following categories will be crowned at the final event of the season: Beginner Skating Champion, Freestyle Champion, Adult Champion, Special Skater Champion, Grand Champion and Overall Team Champion. EVENTS:

Solo programs for Tots through Freestyle 10 and Open Freestyle Bronze through Platinum, Stroking for Tots through Delta, Solo Compulsories Tots through Freestyle 10, Solo Dance 1-10, Dance for Mixed or Shadow levels 1-10, Free Dance, Spotlight - Solo or Couples for Tot through Freestyle 10, Family Spotlight, Artistic for Freestyle 1 through Freestyle 10, Footwork for Freestyle 1-10, Interpretive for Pre Alpha through Freestyle 10, Figures 1-10, Jump & Spin, Ensemble, Team Compulsories, Synchronized Team - Skating and Formation, Production and Hockey events.

FEES

The competition fees are \$45 for a single event, \$10 for each additional event. Fee for entering the Stroking Event or the Hockey Event ONLY is \$20. Family entry fee is \$75 and will include the first event for up to 3 immediate family members. Synchronized Team - \$10 per team member for each event. Entry forms must be received no later than December 18, 2011. The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries. A late fee of \$20 will be charged on applications postmarked or received after December 18, 2011.

SCHEDULE

The final competition schedule will be emailed to each of the ISI coaches and skaters after all entries have been scheduled. For individuals without email please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope.

ELIGIBILITY

All skaters entering the competition must be currently registered individual or professional member of the ISI. All skaters must have their highest and any prerequisite tests registered with the ISI by December 18, 2011. Skaters may not enter an event at a lower level than registered by this time. Ages for the purpose of grouping will be as of Jan 21, 2012.

Members of the USFS who are also registered with the ISI are eligible to compete in accordance with the ISI/USFS Joint Statement of Policy. USFS skaters are encouraged to participate in the new ISI Open Freestyle test levels. For requirements for the minimum ISI test level on which USFS skaters must compete, see chart below:

GENERAL RULES

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the guidelines as outlined in the ISI Handbook. All coaches are responsible for their skaters being aware of the performance rules as outlined in the ISI Handbook. Judges for the competition must be current certified Professional members and all scores will be compiled under the current competition rules. ISI Rule Revisions for 2012 will apply.

PERFORMANCE RULES All routines must start from a stationary position. Timing of a routine begins with any action after the music starts. There is a short warm-up before each division skates except the stroking events.

TOT 1-4 (skaters age 6 and under) will perform a 1-minute program routine with music. They should only perform the required maneuvers from their test level. Additional maneuvers should not be included and will not be judged. 2-foot and/or 1-foot snowplow stops are permitted in Tot events. All Tot competitors must have their test registered with ISI to enter Tot competition events. Coaches will be allowed to help the skater from the ice door but will not be permitted on the ice during the national competition events.

PRE ALPHA through DELTA: Open to skaters of all ages. Skaters must perform one additional maneuver from the Freestyle 1 level and programs should be one minute long. Skaters performing more than one Freestyle 1 maneuver will be penalized.

BETA: The foot must be lifted off the ice for backward crossovers, cutbacks do not meet test requirements.

GAMMA: At least three strokes must precede the mohawk combination for a total of seven steps.

DELTA and FREESTYLE 1: The edges must be done consecutively in any order, outside-outside, inside-inside on an axis. In Delta the lunge must be completed with a one foot glide.

FREESTYLE 1-10 A program performed to music with emphasis on the required test level maneuvers from the skater's current Freestyle level. Various skills are required, depending on the test level. All skaters must pass freestyle test level to compete in this event. Program time will allow for a 10 second leeway over the recommended time. No penalty for skating under the prescribed time. Uncaptured maneuvers as listed in the ISI Handbook will be allowed according to level restrictions recommended. Elements from a higher test level are not permitted.

NEW – OPEN FREESTYLE – Bronze / Silver / Gold / Platinum All Freestyle skaters now have even more options to participate in ISI competition events. Skaters who have passed any level of traditional Freestyle 1-10 tests can also participate in the new Open Freestyle events.

There are ***NO REQUIRED MANEUVERS*** for these new “open” events. Skaters in FS1-3 can participate in the Bronze event and do maneuvers from FS3 and below; skaters in FS4-5 can be in the Silver event and do maneuvers from FS5 and below; skaters in FS5-6 can be in the Gold event and do maneuvers from FS6 and below; and skaters in FS7-10 can be in the Platinum event and do any skating maneuvers.

Judging criteria is: Correctness of Jumps, Correctness of Spins, Correctness of Turns & Edges, Variety of Moves, Music Interpretation, Choreography & Pattern, Posture, Presentation, Duration and General Overall.

STROKING: Open to all Tot through Delta skaters. Competitors will be grouped by age and test level. Skaters will perform forward strokes down the sides of the rink in both directions. Crossovers on the ends of the rink are optional and will not be judged.

SOLO COMPETITION DANCES: This is the skater’s version of Ballroom Dancing. Test levels begin with basic steps and patterns, and then advance to a high performance level. All skaters must pass the required dance test to compete in these events; however they no longer are required to complete the entire higher test - if they have already passed that next higher dance. Ice Dancing can be enjoyed at any age or level. *Skaters are no longer required to pass the Delta test to participate in Ice Dance events.* Two patterns will be skated.

FREE DANCE 1-10 The new ISI Free Dance events are based on the new Free Dance test levels (1-10). Each couple must pass the corresponding test level to compete in Free Dance events. For the competition event, each couple must perform a free dance program of their own design. It should express the couple’s inspirational and artistic capabilities.

COMPULSORY MOVES: Skaters are to perform only the three maneuvers selected by the competition director in any order with a minimum of connecting steps. Each maneuver may only be attempted one time. There is no penalty for the quantity of swizzles, wiggles, strokes or crossovers performed at the Tot-Beta levels. Only the quality of these maneuvers is judged. Additional maneuvers, such as any jump, spin, or gliding maneuver from a test level or any uncaptured move are not allowed. There is a 1-minute time limit for all levels. Tot through Freestyle 5 will be performed on half ice. Freestyle 6 -10 will be performed on full ice.

- Tot 1: March While Moving, March While Standing, Proper way to fall
- Tot 2: Forward Swizzle standing still, Beginning Two Foot Glide, Two foot jump in place
- Tot 3: Push & Glide Stroking, Preparation for Snowplow Stop, Forward Swizzle
- Tot 4: Backward Swizzle, Two foot or One foot Snowplow Stop, Backward Wiggles
- Pre Alpha: Two Foot Glide, Forward Swizzles, Backward Wiggles
- Alpha: Forward Stroking, One Foot Snowplow Stop, Right Over Left Forward Crossovers
- Beta: Backward Stroking, Right T-Stop, Left Over Right Backward Crossovers

Gamma: Right Forward Outside 3-turn, Left Forward Inside Mohawk Combo, Hockey Stop
 Delta: Left Forward Inside 3-turn, Bunny Hop, Lunge
 FS 1: ½ Flip, Two Foot Spin, Waltz Jump
 FS 2: Ballet Jump, ½ Lutz, One Foot Spin
 FS 3: Salchow, Toe Loop, Backward Pivot
 FS 4: Flip, Half Loop, Sit Spin
 FS 5: Lutz, Back Spin, Camel Spin
 FS 6: Jump combination, Choice spin (Cross-foot/Layback/Sit-Change-Sit), Split jump
 FS 7: Double Toe Loop, Two Walley Jumps in Sequence, Flying Camel
 FS 8: Double Flip jump, Flying Sit Spin, Split Lutz jump
 FS 9: Axel-Double Loop Jump Comb, Double Lutz, Flying Camel into Jump Sit Spin
 FS10: Double Axel-Double Toe Loop jump combination, Death Drop, Three Arabian Cartwheel or Butterfly jumps

SPOTLIGHT SOLO PROGRAM (All Levels) This is an entertaining & “fun” routine that emphasizes the skater’s acting ability and not technical skating skills. There is no score for technical merit in this event. The skater must pass a test for Tots, Pre-Alpha to Delta, Freestyle or Open Freestyle to determine the spotlight event level. Spotlight events are divided into three categories listed below. Please mark the correct category on your entry form. Categories may be combined as entries permit.

- a) CHARACTER – a famous or easily identifiable character.
- b) DRAMATIC – a theatrical performance that sets a mood and evokes an emotional response.
- c) LIGHT ENTERTAINMENT – an entertaining or light-hearted performance

Skaters may enter solo and couples as long as the music and the routines are different, but are only allowed to enter ONE solo spotlight event. In spotlight, timing begins with any action after the music begins. The penalty for not following the limitation on moves that a skater may perform during a spotlight is a grade of 2.0 for music and choreography.

Props if used are limited to those that a skater can hand carry or push onto the ice in 30 seconds or less. Props may not be flame or smoke-oriented or any other substance that would alter the ice surface (i.e. sparkles, confetti, whip cream, etc.)

The judging criteria will be costume and/or prop, music & choreography, judge’s appeal, originality and duration. No technical grade.

COUPLES SPOTLIGHT – Low / Medium / High An entertaining spotlight program performed by two skaters using costumes and props.

Skaters do not need to be of the same test level to be partners, however, they must be grouped as Pre-Alpha through Delta (LOW), Freestyle 1-3 and Open Bronze (MEDIUM), Freestyle 4-5 and Open Silver (Intermediate) and Freestyle 6-10 and Open Gold or Open Platinum (HIGH). Skaters will be grouped according to the higher partner's freestyle level. Programs duration for Couples Spotlight: LOW- 1 minute, MEDIUM - 1.5 minute, INTERMEDIATE - 1.5 minutes and HIGH - 2 minutes. All the same rules, guidelines, penalties, etc. for props in Spotlight apply to Couples Spotlight.

FAMILY SPOTLIGHT: Two or more family members can perform an entertaining spotlight routine using costumes & props. If necessary, the event groupings are divided first by number of skaters and then by age groups and/or ability levels. Duration: 1.5 minutes

ARTISTIC: Open to skaters Freestyle 1-10 / Bronze - Platinum.

Skaters perform a program to music with emphasis on strong edges, flow, choreography, innovative moves and musical interpretation. There are no required moves, emphasis is placed on the creative and innovative design of a skating program. The main focus should be on strong edges, body positions, flow, music interpretation, rhythm, choreography and artistry. There is no score for technical merit. Artistic skating differs from Dramatic Spotlight in that the latter focuses on emotional themes, costumes, props, etc. Event level is based on skater's freestyle test level. Timing begins with any action after the music begins. No props are permitted.

FOOTWORK: Open to skaters Freestyle 1 through Freestyle 10. Skaters are grouped together by age and level, and perform any footwork sequences that are not mandatory dance step sequences in any freestyle test level. Emphasis should be on a variety of turns and clean edges. No props are permitted. Programs are one minute for all levels. Skaters may not perform any jumps over ½ rotation (the half loop is a full rotation jump) or any spins over 3 revolutions. Skaters must comply with the event criteria as described in the ISI Handbook.

INTERPRETIVE: Open to skaters Pre Alpha through Freestyle 10/ Bronze - Platinum. Freestyle level skaters will hear a piece of music once off the ice; twice during the group warm-up; and once more before competing while they mentally choreograph a skating routine – with no help from friends, parents or

coaches. The emphasis is on the skater's ability to choreograph an entertaining skating routine to music and not on the difficulty of the skating maneuvers performed.

FIGURES 1-10 Regular figures are based on the original “school” figure eights. Skaters perform a required figure patterns 3 times on each foot. Judging is based on the size & shape of the circles, cleanliness of edges & pattern. All skaters must pass the required figure test to compete in these events.

HOCKEY EVENT: Open to hockey players of all ages. Skaters will race one or two at a time skating one forward lap around the rink carrying the puck on the stick. After completing the forward lap, the skater will drop the puck, keep the stick and skate another lap around the rink backwards. The skater with the best time wins. All participants must wear the following pieces of equipment: Hockey Skates, Helmet with Face Mask, Mouth Guard, Shoulder Pads, Elbow Pads, Shin Pads, Hip Pads, Support Cup, Gloves, and a Regulation Hockey Stick.

JUMP & SPIN – Low / Medium / Intermediate / High Two skaters enter the ice as a team. The first skater performs their choice of a required jump 2 times, followed by the second skater performing their choice of a required spin 2 times. Only the best attempt of each required element will be judged. *Only the technical accuracy of the required element is judged – the difficulty of the chosen element is not considered during judging for this event.* **ALL JUMP & SPIN EVENTS will be done on ½ ICE ONLY. Category Levels:**

Low	Both skaters must be in Pre-Alpha to Delta levels ONLY
Medium	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 1-3 levels or below.
Intermediate	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 4-5 levels or below.
High	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 6-10 levels or below.

If two skaters from different category levels wish to compete together, the team will be entered in the highest level of the two skaters. Required Elements:

TEAM COMPULSORIES 1-10 (*Freestyle Levels Only*) Six skaters (or seven skaters for FS6-10 levels) perform a lively and entertaining routine in which each skater performs one required test level maneuver (in the order listed in the *ISI Handbook*). Lively music with entertaining themes, great costumes and hand-held props are featured in this event. Skaters can compete on more than one team as long as those two teams are in different freestyle levels. Skater may skate above, but not below their own freestyle test level.

ENSEMBLE (*All Levels*) Similar to Solo Spotlight and Production Team, this event is open to groups of 3-7 skaters of all levels and ages. Skaters will be judged on the performance value of the program. There are no required maneuvers and there is no technical score for this event. The group should use music, costumes & props to enhance the theme while creating an entertaining performance. The costume & prop guidelines for Ensemble are the same as the guidelines for Solo Spotlight events. Props are not allowed on warm-up. Duration: 3 minutes

PRODUCTION TEAM (*All Levels*) This team event is for groups of 8 or more skaters. Team will be judged on the performance value of the program. There are no required maneuvers and no technical score for this event. The group should use music along with elaborate costumes and props to enhance the theme while creating an entertaining performance. Skaters from all levels can participate in this event. Event entries will be divided into Small / Medium / Large / Extravaganza categories.

KALEIDOSKATE (*All Levels*) A group of 8 or more skaters perform a fun and entertaining group number. Minimal skating skills are required for this event. Each skater represents a piece of color – and those color pieces are used to choreograph and create constantly changing patterns, designs and formations on the ice. Creativity, use of color and props are also an important part of the overall “design”.

SYNCHRONIZED SKATING TEAMS All ISI synchronized teams have between 8-24 skaters. ISI synchronized events are divided into 5 categories: Formation, Advanced Formation, Skating, Open Skating and Dance. Competition will be conducted in accordance with the new 2012 ISI Test and Competition Rule Revisions.

Formation teams are newer teams doing basic formations with basic skating skills and mainly forward skating. Backward skating can be done on 2-feet only. Lifts and rotation jumps are not allowed in the formation category. This is a great way for teams to learn the basics of synchronized skating.

New! Advance Formation teams have already competed in the Formation event, but skaters on these teams can only do 3-turns and mohawks in turning from forward to backward (or vice-versa). Lifts and rotation jumps are not allowed in the advanced formation category. This is a great way for teams to take the next step as they continue to improve the basics of synchronized skating

Skating teams have already mastered the basics of synchronized skating and execute superior formations with speed, difficulty and accuracy. There is a minimum of stops and 2-foot skating in the skating category. Teams should have smooth transitions and effortless performance. Unison, cleanness and speed are expected. Lifts are permitted in the Teen Skating events only.

New! Open Skating teams are advanced skating teams. There are no required maneuvers in this event category, but the lift restrictions for the traditional skating team events are still in effect. More freedom of expression and variety of moves is important in this team routine

Synchronized Skating and Synchronized Formation and Advanced Formation Events– The 5 basic elements (Block, Circle, Line, Wheel and Intersection) will each be added in both events as a separate Judge Criteria score.

If more than one of the same element is skated during the routine, as for all other ISI competition events, the best performance will be used as the element score and the additional elements will be scored under “Technical Merit” or “Correctness”.

There are many variations of each element. The descriptions below are the minimum requirements. If performed well, adding features such as step sequences, changes of hold, changes of configuration, changes or rotation and traveling can increase the difficulty of the element.

Block: An element where skaters are arranged in a minimum of 3 lines. The lines may be a straight, diagonal, curved or circular pattern. The lines of skaters should be straight with all skaters evenly spaced.

Circle: The shape should be round with even spacing between the skaters. There should not be any visible pulling or tugging between skaters.

Line: The line can be skated in one straight line, parallel lines, diagonal lines, etc.

Wheel: An element where all of the skaters rotate around a common center point. It can be done in different formations including 2, 3, 4 and 5-spoke wheels and parallel wheels. All spokes of the wheel should be straight and the lean of the skaters should be in the same direction.

Intersection: Any element where one half of the team intersects the other half of the team. No backward spirals are allowed.

Synchronized Formation Compulsory events – Each element below is to be performed only one time in any order. If performed more than once, as per all other ISI competition events, the first performance will be scored. Extra elements can be performed but won’t be judged. Vocal music is acceptable.

Forward Line – Must be performed in shoulder hold to cover at least half of the ice surface and consist only of forward strokes or marching.

Forward Circle – No change from the previous requirement description.

Forward Two-Spoke Wheel – No change from the previous requirement description

Forward Block – Must be performed in shoulder hold covering at least half of the ice surface. Any forward skating steps maybe be performed; however, no additional moves such as arabesques, lunges, bunny hops, etc. are allowed.

Synchronized Skating Compulsory events – Each element below is to be performed only one time in any order. If performed more than once, as per all other ISI competition events, the first performance will be scored. Extra elements can be performed but won’t be judged. Vocal music is acceptable.

Line – No change from the previous requirement description.

Footwork Block – A block of at least three lines consisting of any skating steps and turns which covers the length of the ice. The block may change direction and changes of hold are also permitted.

Circle – No change from the previous requirement description.

Wheel – No change from the previous requirement description.

Intersection – Any intersection or combination of intersections in which one half of the team moves through the other half of the team. If multiple intersections are performed, they must be continuous. Team members may perform different steps.

AGE DIVISIONS: Age determined each year on the previous July 1.
